- 4 - Discussed cost of tree in front of Town Hall, about \$500, which is being donated by the Warner Business Association. Marc Violette suggested this gift be presented to the Selectmen formally so they can accept the gift.
- 5 - Mary Morris advised she received an email from someone at the Men's Club about the design of the signs (at each end of town). New signs are being made up, and Mary said she'd follow up on that.
- 6 - Marc suggested the WBA should give a scholarship --- motion was made (and approved) to donate \$500 to the New London Rotary Club .
- 7 - The May 17 Retailers Day was discussed. Mary Morris and Lauren French said they are trying to find someone who can head up the kids activities. They have the floral arrangements for the contest and some raffle items. The Women's Club will be holding a plant sale that day, Rowe Mtn. Fair Trade may do a fashion show. Cheryl from The Maples is working with Jim Mitchell on public relations. The artisans will be set up at Brookside.
- 8 - Laura Buono gave us an update at Town Hall:
 - another monthly newsletter about town happenings was done
 - getting ready to start the 2007 audit process
 - the 1st meeting for the Hazard Mitigation Program was held yesterday, April 14
 - the meeting tonight will hold some discussion on the Zero Waste Program which is being looked into. Warner must think about what will happen if some of the landfills close up?
- 9 - Dan Watts advised there are some new members on the Planning Board now, and 50% of them are Citizens for Smart Growth. Another survey is being developed to send out to Warner residents about whether or not there are any items that need to be added to or amended on the Master Plan. This is done every 10 yrs.
