Brookside: Healing theme will now include new KACC member Lake Sunapee Regional VNA & Hospice who will be offering health screening clinics: Blood Pressure, Glucose and Ask-A-Nurse.

Church: will be available as a respite station in addition to offering a bake sale plus hot dogs and hamburgers during lunch (time to be determined).

Cheryl will be providing BBQ meal. Middle/high school dance team will offer snacks/drinks. Food will be available at 6PM and music will begin at 6:30PM. There will be a \$5 cover charge to enter. This will be a concert, not a Battle of the Bands type of event. A letter will be sent to the Selectmen seeking free use of the area.

Publicity: Cheryl has printed 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 posters. There will be radio ads to be broadcast during the news. The ad for the Messenger will include rest stop information.
