Warner Public Market has remained open and increased its hours adding Tuesday! We are now open **Tue-Fri 1-7 and Sat & Sun 10-4.** And this will likely increase soon as well.

Orders can either be placed **online** and picked up curbside or made through our front door ordering system. (we do not have plans to reopen the store floor to the public at this time, we will continue to observe the situation to insure safety of our customers and staff)

We are fully stocked with local produce, meat, fresh fish, cheese, milk, fruit, preserves, bulk staples, many household products and more. With new items arriving weekly from area farms as we move into the growing season. Last week was NH fiddleheads and the week is all about NH asparagus!

We are partnering with Mainstreet Warner Inc, The Warner Area Food Pantry and local farms to coordinate hundreds of lbs of food to those in need weekly. This has been done through the generous donations of our members, customers, and community members.
